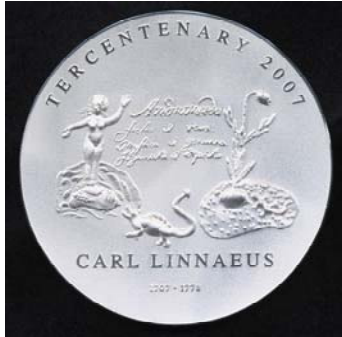


The Linnean Society of London awards three Tercentenary Medals

The Linnean Tercentenary Medal (Obverse): Linnaeus' drawing of Andromeda from his Lapland journey, chosen for the freshness and liveliness of the original drawing. The words 'Tercentenary 2007' and 'Carl Linnaeus 1707 - 1778' appear around the image.

The Linnean Tercentenary Medal (Reverse): Modelled on Ehret's original illustration for Linnaeus' Systema Naturae arranged in a spiral out from a profile of Linnaeus. The word "illustrat" (he illumines) which ends the spiral pays homage to Linnaeus' great gift as a teacher and communicator in his lifetime, and also indicates that his great works continue to shed light.
